The FutureShack 2011 jury features Mary Johnston FAIA and Vulcan's go-to sustainability advocate Jason Twill. Moderating the program will be KUOW 94.9 host Ross Reynolds who will help us explore how architecture can help improve the quality of our lives through a live, public discussion.

FutureShack is a dialogue between the public and design professionals focused on new ways to think about residential architecture in all its forms. FutureShack showcases creative responses to the challenges posed by our changing lifestyles, across a wide range of building types, budgets, constraints and social agendas. Part debate about how we want to live, part recognition of innovative architecture, FutureShack is an evening of lively public discussion at Seattle Center's Fisher Pavilion.

All participating projects will be showcased on AIA Seattle's FutureShack website and selected projects are included in the Seattle Times' Pacific Northwest Magazine cover story and presented at the live event on Sept. 20, 2011.

This 59,000 sf, LEED gold, facility is situated along the banks of the Columbia River in The Dalles at Lone Pine Village. Water's Edge provides a holistic wellness program in a community-based environment designed to create a healing experience for patrons. The facility includes three pools, a gymnasium, physical therapy suite, medical offices and a spa center.
